

No side in the Evo-Stik Southern Premier Division South possesses a 100% record following last Saturday's round of matches.

There are five teams yet to taste defeat, with Tiverton Town dropping their first points of the campaign to date after drawing 2-2 at Earlsmead against Harrow Borough.

And it was so nearly the first loss for Tivvy as, after taking a 12th-minute lead through Levi Landricombe, they trailed to Anthony O`Connor and George Moore goals in the 57th and 78th minutes going into time added on when Nick Hurst equalised in the 92nd minute.

Weymouth, Merthyr Town and Hendon are the others to remain unbeaten who played on Saturday. The Terras inflicted a horrible 5-0 home battering on a Chesham United side who have lost all four matches to date.

Brandon Goodship's second hat-trick of the season already in the 41st minute from the penalty spot, 73 and 79 minutes sealed the victory with Ben Thomson and Stephane Zubar adding the others.

Merthyr won 1-0 at the Rushmoor Community Stadium against Farnborough, thanks to a 55th minute Tom Meechan effort – Boro finished with ten men after a second booking for Michael Fernandes 15 minutes from time.

Hendon looked to be heading for victory

at promoted Taunton Town as they led 3-2 through a Ricardo German hat-trick in the seventh, 34th and 56th minutes at the Viridor Stadium, with Matt Wright on 41 minutes and Dan Sullivan on 66 minutes netting for the Peacocks. But a leveller six minutes into stoppage time from Wright again rescued a point for the home side.

Basingstoke Town had a good 4-1 success at a yet-to-win Frome Town, with Sam Argent after eight minutes, Shane Hollamby ten minutes later and a Dean Stow penalty giving them a 3-0 interval lead. Dan Cottle reduced the arrears on 59 minutes, but a fourth immediately afterwards from Zidan Akers sealed Stoke's win.

Gosport Borough were the day's other winners – 2-1 at Privett Park against Staines Town. Harry Stow's late goal did not stop Gosport winning their second home game of the season, goals for Boro' courtesy of boss Craig McAllister and Patrick Suraci secured the win.

Cameron Murray bagged a brace for Dorchester Town at the Avenue Stadium against Kings Langley, but they were pegged back by Davide Pobbe and Gary Connolly efforts in a 2-2 draw. And that was the outcome at Tatnam between relegated Poole Town and switched Metropolitan Police, whose Jack Mazzone`s brace in the 16th and 88th minutes were sandwiched by replies from Jamie Whisken and Marvin Brooks.


☐ **BLYTH AFC** are reportedly in serious danger of going out of existence.

Mark Carruthers for the New Post Leader reports that club owner Barry Elliott believes difficulty in returning to their hometown and a lack of support has made the club unsustainable. The club have been playing their home fixtures at Ashington's Woodhorn Lane since February, having left their South Newsham ground due to concerns over the quality of their pitch.

Moves to head back to Blyth have been blocked by the local council and despite Elliott claiming he had approached National League North neighbours Blyth Spartans over a groundshare at Croft Park, Spartans have denied that any recent approach has been made.

Elliott said: "We didn't really realise how little support we had until the first few games of this season. There were 80 supporters at our first home game and just over that at the second one and I put on a free bus to the FA Cup game at Glasshoughton Welfare but nobody took me up on the offer."

☐ CHESTER were forced to postpone their National League match with Hereford on bank Holiday Monday due to damage sustained by recent inclement weather. The Blues confirmed the postponement in this statement prior to last weekend: "Due to the continuing issues affecting basic power



supply and electronic safety equipment within the stadium at Chester despite efforts to return the stadium to an operational and safe mode, in time for the Bank Holiday Monday fixture on 27th August versus Hereford in the Vanarama National League North, it has reluctantly been postponed to a date to be arranged.

Consultation was taken throughout with regards to this decision with the local Safety Advisory Group, The National League and both clubs along with a number of possible alternative arrangements being eventually discounted due to match management staffing, policing and safe stewarding levels.

"There's no place like home."

For many of us, our local grounds are like a second home; they bring comfort and a familiarity, and if you're lucky a comfy seat with a choice of cold or hot beverage.

Which is a nice thought for me to imagine when I travel on the train to NLP towers on an uncomfortable chair and without the option of a beverage. Last weekend on the journey to the office the train was filled with West Ham United fans on their way to the top flight match against Bournemouth. By chance, I got speaking to a chap sat opposite who had an Irons jacket on and he began talking about how he is a season ticket holder at West Ham but also goes to watch Dagenham & Redbridge 'four or five times a season'.

Two teams with a proud tradition and standing in their community, but a case of David and Goliath.

"The bigger they are the harder they fall." Well, not exactly in this case.

Ever since the city of London won the bid to host the 2012 Olympics I have followed the story of what the government and the Greater London Authority planned to do with the stadium in Stratford long after Mo Farah and Jessica Ennis had graced it.

After the 16 days of sporting excellence were showcased to the world, focus switched to whether Jeremy Hunt, sport minister at the time, and Mayor Boris Johnson could get the right deal for the taxpayer by finding a tenant who would prevent the stadium from turning into a defunct patch of overgrowth and stinging nettles.

Could they do it? Absolutely not.

As of a year ago, £783m of taxpayers' money had been spent on the stadium with an annual bill of £20m invoiced for security and cleaning and a host of other services.

So bad was the deal struck by the ground owners' London Legacy Development Corporation (LLDC) with West Ham, they appealed against a granted Freedom of Information Act request to have the tenancy contract made public. This after it was known that West Ham would pay £2.5m-a-year in rent over a 99-year lease.

Promotions followed for Hunt and Johnson, West Ham's co-owners sold Upton Park after 110 years on Green Street, while the Daggers sold top goalscorer Oli Hawkins to Portsmouth for an undisclosed fee after relegation to the National League.

Joined by fellow East Londoners Leyton Orient in dropping to the fifth tier, some fan groups have labelled the tenancy agreement as 'state aid'. The sum of £2.5m a small drop in the Premier League club's well of riches.

I brought this up with the man on the train who said he and a lot of other supporters had failed to analyse what their board was selling them with the move.

I asked him whether it must be painful watching football in a stadium built for athletic purposes when Upton Park offered such a good atmosphere. So why not swap his season ticket in 2019 for one at the Daggers?

"They need to start winning games if they want to get more than 1,500 through the gate," he said. "Go where you feel at home, you're not a 400m hurdler are you?" I joked.

Gary played for the likes of Hendon, Doncaster Rovers, Northwoodand Telford United before injury put paid to his playing career. In his first spell at SYCOB he led the club to a runners up spot in the Berks & Bucks Cup as well as a highly respectable eighth place in the league. In a brief second spell he led the club away from the relegation zone before moving onto Egham Town where he achieved consecutive Play Off places. Installed as the first manager of Beaconsfield Town he led The Rams to the Evo-Stik League South, East title in 2017-18.

OUR VISITORS - TIVERTON TOWN

The summer of 1913 saw the birth of what is now Tiverton Town from the ashes of the recently demised rugby club.

Honorary secretary Sid Skinner proposed the change of code and the newly formed Tiverton Athletic played host to Exeter City at the Athletic Ground at the start of September for the inaugural match.

City won 7-0 but the first Tiverton president Mr. Ford was already prepared to make the bold claim that the new team could become champions of the county.

Those days were many years off, and the first season had barely been completed when war broke out and Tiverton Athletic were forced to adjourn their journey.

Play resumed following the Great War and after the 1921-22 season it was decided that a merger between Athletic and Uffculme St. Peters would take place, having been rejected the previous year.

The newly formed club, known as Tiverton AFC, moved from the Tiverton & District League to the East Devon League and grabbed their first piece of major silverware

by pipping Exminster to the league title. It was a championship they would retain for the following three years and the foundations of a successful local football team were well and truly in place.

Tiverton Town has a history of which to be proud, and particularly in recent times some players that have graced the Ladysmead turf have been etched into Tivvy legend.

Kevin Smith broke Frank Butler's goalscoring record and went on to net 302 goals for the club, and Phil Everett eclipsed this total, eventually finishing his Tivvy career with 378 strikes.

Smith and Neil Saunders captained the club to victories beneath Wembley's twin towers, while Steve Daly, Kevin Nancekivell and Jason Smith are among the best players ever to appear in Tiverton colours.

But without their forefathers none of the success of the past 25 years, that has seen them progress to the Southern League from the Western League and also enjoy FA Vase glory, would be possible, and Tivvy are proud to remember all those involved with the club over the last 105 years. Hopefully we can make further progress.

River Allen: Skilful, classy midfielder joined Tiverton permanently this summer following his release from Truro City and impressed hugely during a short loan period last season. Began his career at Plymouth Argyle.

Liam Armstrong: Promising young goalkeeper who is expected to have a high-profile future in the game and signed his first professional contract with Bristol Rovers this summer. Has rejoined Tiverton Town on loan.

Tom Bath: Forward who joined the Yellows at the start of the 2016-17 season and chipped in with vital goals throughout that season, including one in each of the play-off victories over Taunton Town and Salisbury. Previously with Alphington and Willand Rovers.


Harry Evans: Powerful centre forward who signed for the Yellows this summer from Bodmin Town where he scored 16 times in 28 appearances during a season interrupted by injury. Began his career at Truro City and has been at Falmouth Town and St Austell.

Tom Gardner: Classy central defender who will likely exceed an amazing 600 career appearances for Tiverton this season. Began at Seaton Town in 1997 and spells at Bridport and Exmouth Town followed which brought him to the Yellows' attention.

Nick Hurst: Attacking wing back who loves to get forward and can operate on either flank. Nick began his playing career in the Plymouth Argyle youth set-up before spending the 2014-15 season at Falmouth Town and the following season at Bodmin Town before joining Tiverton at the start of the 2016-17 promotion season.

Josh Key: Joined the Yellows in the summer on a six-month loan period from Exeter City. Pacy midfielder who has had previous Southern League experience, a three-month loan spell at Bideford during the 2017-18 season.

Levi Landricombe: Prolific centre forward who to date has scored 95 goals in only 124 appearances since joining the Yellows in November 2015.



Manager Martyn Rogers is into his second spell at the Ladysmead helm and led the club back to the Southern League Premier Division. Currently the most successful manager the club has ever seen after leading the Yellows to three FA Vase finals during the 1990s winning in 1998 and 1999.

Michael Landricombe: Vice-captain Michael can play in defence as well as midfield and was the only player to start all 46 league matches for the Yellows last season. He signed permanently from Plymouth Parkway for the start of the 2016-17 season.

Ben Mammola: Commanding centre half Ben began his career in the Exeter & District Leagues playing for Topsham, Exeter Civil Service & Clyst Valley before his performances earned him a move to Southern League side Shortwood United in 2006. Joined Tiverton Town in 2015.

Jamie Price: Club captain. Jamie Began his career at Yeovil Town in 2003 before joining Bideford in 2006, spending 12 months in North Devon. He then went on to spend three years at both Bridgwater and Weston Super Mare.

HISTORY OF THE RAMS

Though formed as recently as the summer of 2017 the roots of Beaconsfield Town FC stem from Beaconsfield SYCOB which was founded in 1994 following a merger between Beaconsfield United and Slough Youth Centre Old Boys - hence the 'SYCOB' in the club's name.

United dated back to 1921 and were themselves a coming together of two local teams whilst Slough Youth Centre formed their first football team in 1938. With Slough Youth Centre Old Boys unable to progress due to a lack of ground provisions and United themselves struggling on and off the field at the time the decision was taken to amalgamate the two clubs and so Beaconsfield SYCOB was born.

Initially playing in the London Spartan Premier Division, and with Fred Deanus as chairman, Beaconsfield chalked up a series of Top Five finishes before finally winning the league in 2000-01 under the guidance of Simon Delahunty. However they were refused promotion to the Isthmian League due to some harsh technicalities over the terms of their lease. A further three seasons were spent in the Spartan South Midlands Premier Division before SYCOB again won the league in 2003-04 and this time gained promotion to the Southern Football League - Division One East.

The Rams made solid progress in their early years at Step Four and over three seasons played in three different leagues – Division One East, Division One West and finally Division One South & West from where they were relegated in 2006-07. However the appointment of ex-player Jamie Jarvis, ably assisted by Peter Scott and with Bob Breen as chairman, saw The Rams not only win the Spartan South Midlands Premier Division at the first attempt but also win the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Trophy and the Premier Division League Cup, a fantastic treble of silverware. Promoted to Division One South & West, the club finished a highly creditable fourth place and made the play-offs before losing out to AFC Totton. Moving to the Southern League Midland Division for 2009-10 and with Fred Deanus returning as chairman, SYCOB then went through a succession of managers, players, highs and lows until finishing in bottom place in 2010-11. Only a reprieve and a league restructure saved The Rams from the drop but since then they have gone on to over achieve for a club of its size.

Under the guidance of Byron Walton they finished fifth in the 2011-12 season and lost out in the play-off final to Bedworth United. The following season and with James Pritchard at the helm they again finished fifth but lost out to Rugby Town in a play-off semifinal though the season did finish with some silverware following a fine win over Chesham United in the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Cup.

The 2013-14 campaign saw Gary Meakin take over as manager just five days before the start of the season and with only five players on the clubs books – to finish eighth and reach the quarter-finals of the League Cup was a fine achievement as was a runner up spot in the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Cup, Chesham United gaining revenge for defeat 12 months earlier. The 2014-15 season saw a partnership with the FAB Academy who provided the bulk of the teams players under the stewardship of Andy Hurley and Nas Bashir. That partnership continued into 2015-16 season with Geoff Warner as manager as The Rams finished in a respectable ninth place while the 2016-17 season saw them under the joint stewardship of Andy Hurley and Leigh Wooldridge and ended with a 16th place league finish though a run to the Fourth Qualifying Round of the FA Cup was a 'Best Ever' for SYCOB.

The 2017-18 season saw the return of Gary Meakin as the first manager of the newly named Beaconsfield Town, with Chris Coyle as chairman. The Rams had virtually a whole new team and, helped by an amazing away record, they kept in touch with the League pacesetters to finally gain top spot on the last day of the season and claim the Evo-Stik League South, East title. 2018-19 sees Beaconsfield Town competing at Step Three for the first time in their history in the newly formed Evo-Stik League South Premier South division.
