A LOOK AT THE LATEST HAPPENINGS IN AND AROUND THE EVO-STIK PREMIER DIVISION SOUTH THROUGHOUT 2018-2019



Tiverton Town and Hartley Witney are the unlikely league leaders of the Evo-Stik Southern Premier League South, albeit at this early stage of the 2018-2019 campaign.

Hartley Witney who have made a staggering rise from the Combined Counties League required a Nathan Smart winner five minutes into stoppage time to defeat Frome Town, and in doing so keep up their perfect start of the season.

Veteran manager Martyn Rogers (pictured) however sees his side sit top; a 5-1 victory at Ladymead against Walton Casuals played its part in giving his team a superior goal difference over Hartley Witney. Weymouth dropped their first points of the season at The Wessex on Saturday afternoon as they could only manage a 1-1 home draw against winless Beaconsfield Town. The Terras who finished fifth last season despite a mammoth ninety-seven point haul thanked Joshua Wakefield's equaliser two minutes from time to cancel out Brendan Matthew's strike just after half-time.

At the foot of the table Chesham United and Kings Langley remain the only two sides without a point, Chesham were hit by two late Staines Town goals to lose 3-1 whilst Kings Langley were outdone 2-1 by Taunton Town in Hertfordshire.

Emmanuel joined Staines Town on loan from Oxford United in August 2018. He had been with at Reading's John Madejski Academy before joining The U's in summer 2015, and within a couple of years had earned a pro' contract. Had a loan spell with North Leigh in 2016/17, and in the second half of last season had a month on loan at Hampton & Richmond Borough followed by three at Leatherhead. Mature beyond his years, he has great reflexes and is a good organiser of his defence. Although born in London, he is reported to have opted to commit to play for his ancestral home of Nigeria.



ELAN ASSIANA

A former junior at Fulham, where he won the U14 Premier League Cup and was Player of the Year, he was picked up by Manchester City, playing in their U16s, youths, and reserves and winning the League. On 6 October 2014 he was transferred to Charlton Athletic and gained further National League honours, winning the U18 and U23 titles. On 8.11.13 he gained his England U16 cap, playing against Northern Ireland. Elan was born in the Republic of the Congo, and also gained U20 caps for that nation. As well as being a powerful central defender, he can also operate as a right back, striker, or central midfielder.





RUUDI CLARKE

After starting out at Walton Casuals, Ruudi was quickly snapped up by Queens Park Rangers, where he played right through from the U8s to the U23



LIAM HIGGINS

Joining Staines Town in May 2018, Liam is 6'1" tall and comfortable in the centre or left side of the defence. Spent the early part of his career playing in his native New Zealand, both in summer (national) league, and the regionalised winter competitions, playing for teams such as Upper Hutt AFC, Lower Hutt AFC, Team Wellington, Wellington Phoenix, Young Heart Manawatu, WaiBOP United [Waihato / Bay Of Plenty], Stop Out FC, and a second stint at Team Wellington. Crossing the Tasman Sea, he appeared for Australian clubs Noble Park United, Richmond SC, and South Springvale Aris. He earned a total of 17 caps for New Zealand at all levels.







WICKENS

Harryson came to Staines Town from in June 2018 having spent the previous season in Aldershot Town and AFC Wimbledon. He was part of The Shots U19 squad that won their National U19 Alliance divisional championship by a remarkable 19 points. He is 5'8" tall and has previous experience at Norwich City and Walton Casuals.



BRENDAN MURPHY-MCVEY



ABOUT TOWN

'Easy now, me breadsticks' - a little unfairly Staines has become



To go by its full name - Staines-upon-Thames lies seventeen miles west of London in Surrey. Tracing its roots back to the Roman era, the first mention of a settlement was as a river crossing in AD43 following the invasion of Claudius in the same year.

The town built its reputation as a location of several coaching inns, based in a convenient location owing to its proximity to the City of London and also lying along the Trafalgar Way which linked the capital to the maritime centre of Falmouth.

Like many areas in and around London, the railway allowed suburban expansion, especially during the industrial revolution of the mid 1800s. Theses days however, the town attributes the majority of its economy to the nearby Heathrow Airport.


