





MANAGER PREVIEW WITH JOHN ROBERTSON

George Oakley started Caley Thistle season off perfectly as his 9th minute strike was enough to seal all three points against Paul Hartley's new look Falkirk side.

Caley Thistle took the lead early on as Tom Walsh found Oakley free in the box and he finished low past Falkirk goalkeeper Leo Fasan.

Oakley then saw a header go just wide off the post after he found in the box by Tom Walsh again.

In the second-half, Nathan Austin had a big chance to double Caley Thistle's advantage as he was clean through on goal however Fasan was equal to it and kept his side in the match.

Falkirk thought they had levelled the game after 60 minutes as Irving's free-kick was headed in by Dallison but referee Steven McLean ruled it out for a foul.

Shaun Rooney went close to scoring his first goal for the Caley Jags as his header went narrowly wide from a Joe Chalmers corner.

Liam Polworth could have sealed the game late on but his shot was wide after being set up by, new signing, Sean Welsh.

The Caley Jags held on for their first opening day League win since the 2014/15 season.

TALKS VICE CAPTAINCY AND REACHING 200

Despite only being 27-years-old, Aaron Doran is one of the most experienced players in the Caley Thistle squad. Doran could reach a landmark today that only 15 other players have reached, by making his 200th Caley Thistle appearance.

Doran could join the company of Charlie Christie, Richard Hastings, Mike Teasdale, Ross Tokley, Bobby Mann, Barry Wilson, Stuart Golabeck, Roy McBain, Dennis Wyness, Russell Duncan, Mark Brown, Grant Munro, Richie Foran, Ross Draper and Gary Warren in reaching the milestone.

The Irishman said about potentially reaching the feat: "I think it would have come a lot sooner if I didn't get the injuries I've got in the last few seasons. However, 200 appearances for the club is great honour and hopefully I get it this weekend."

"I just want to play as many games as I can for this club now I'm over my injuries, I just want to get out onto the pitch and improve, get better and help the team as much as I can. It's a great honour."

Doran has come a long since arriving as a young player from Blackburn Rovers in 2011, he has now been given the responsibility of being the vice-captain of the club and he is enjoying the role.

Doran said "Yeah, it's brilliant. It's an honour to be asked to be vice-captain and it's good to be understudy to Carlo, he's a good lad and one to learn from for all the lads."

"We have a pretty young squad so I'm just going to try and pass on some experience,





I've been here a good few years now so if there's anything I can do to help lads then I will do it! I try and speak more and as I said there's some good young players here, so I want to help them develop their game and develop my own game as well. It's been a really good start as vice-captain."

Caley Thistle won their opening match against Falkirk last Saturday, and despite not being involved Doran was pleased with the performance as he said: "It's a lot a better a start that we had last season where it took us a lot of games to get going. To come away with a win against Falkirk, away from home, is a great start for the lads and I think we can only build on that."

"The Hearts game, the week before was a difficult one, we lost three goals in a five-minute spell. We didn't think the performance was too bad overall, but we just continued from where we left off in our pre-season games. The result against Falkirk was a good one for the lads, it was a great defensive display and it was good to get a win on the first day of the season."

After a poor start last term, Doran is hoping the Caley Jags begin this season in a better fashion: "You can see the way we ended last season, we went on a very good run not losing many games at all and we just wanted to continue that momentum. As we know, we didn't have the best of starts last season but if we can build on that, play the way we can play, then we'll be in the running at the end of the season hopefully."

Ayr Utd have started the new season on fire, as they've won their opening five matches. Doran knows the threat that they will bring to the Caledonian Stadium today, but he wants to see the Caledonian Stadium become a fortress.

Doran said: "We've watched some clips of Ayr, they've scored a lot of goals in pre-season and the Betfred Cup. They've won all five of their games this season, so we know what they are going to be all about, they are going to be dangerous."

"Their strikers are on good form and scoring a lot of goals, but we don't really look too much into that, we know we are a good team with good players and we're just trying to keep doing what we are doing.

We're at home and we want to make our home ground a bit of a fortress, we want teams to be scared to come play us, so we just want another good home win and take it from there."

Doran was also delighted to see Ryan Esson awarded a testimonial match, after 10 years of service at the club, and Doran knows Esson is one of the hardest working people at the club but thinks he's crazy too!

Doran said: "It's brilliant, Ryan is a top man, I think he's taken charge of the younger lads and taken charge of the goalkeepers every day, so he puts a lot of work in."



The title was sealed against Ayr Utd, in a remarkable game at Somerset Park. Caley Thistle raced into a 3-0 lead early through early strikes from Jonny Hayes, Adam Rooney and Richie Foran. Eric Odhiambo made it four before the break and goals in the second-half from Dani Sanchez, Robert Eagle and Gavin Morrison sealed the 7-0 win.
