

THE CORNWALL CHARITY CUP AND THE INVICTUS TRUST

The Invictus Trust is a small, local, relatively new charity which aims to support and offer services to Cornwall youngsters suffering from mental health issues

It was founded in 2010 by the Cowburn family following the death of Ben Cowburn aged 18 after a short period of mental illness

The Trust is led and driven by young people who raise awareness through events, campaigns, social media and talks in schools about adolescent mental well-being

A major fundraising event is the Invictus Glitter Ball, being held on Saturday 9th December at Retallack Resort near Newquay

The Trust has been lobbying for an adolescent mental health unit to be built in Cornwall, where there are currently no residential facilities

Where Cornwall-based families have to travel large distances to visit their children in locations as far away as Manchester and Kent, the Trust offers financial support in the form of a travel grant

After 6 years of campaigning, the NHS have been granted £5m to build a new local unit. The Invictus Trust says it is working to ensure the new unit is truly fit-for-purpose and can provide innovative care for the County youngsters who need it.

FIRST TEAM ACTION

MOUSEHOLE 4-1 DOBWALLS, SWPLD1W, SATURDAY 21ST OCTOBER, AT TRUNGLE PARC

Only two West Division fixtures went ahead on the day – the other being on Plymouth Marjon's artificial surface - and in Mousehole's case the investment in a new drainage and pitch resurfacing scheme over the summer months paid immediate dividends in enabling the club to host its first home League game of the season after playing the first 9 matches away from home. Despite the atrocious weather conditions, the match was never in doubt, with the new pitch easily coping with the heavy overnight rain and the torrential downpour that beset the second half.

The high wind made accurate passing and ball control difficult, but Mousehole adapted much better to the conditions and swept into a 3-0 lead just after the half-hour. In the 10th minute, Tyler Tonkin's long pass down the right touchline put Luke Johnson in behind his marker, and the low cross was met by Caleb Marsden arriving on the far side of the six-yard box to side-foot in. It was 2-0 after 25 minutes, as Matt McIlroy created space on the edge of the box for a left-foot drive that squirmed under the keeper. Tyler Tonkin then scored the proverbial 'scorcher' on 32 minutes, his rising drive from the right of the area arrowing into the far top corner. Two minutes before half-time Dobwalls pulled a goal back against the run of play when Billy Curtis' slip on the wet surface allowed Bentley Alacantra a clear run in. The second half was a different story, with Dobwalls on the front foot, but apart from two great saves from Steve Parker-Billinge in the opening and closing minutes - one a close-range block, the other a tip-over from a long-range shot - the weather was the winner, disrupting the pattern of play and testing the players' resilience. The alert Luke Johnson finally ended any prospect of a Dobwalls comeback in the last minute when he intercepted a pass deep in the visitors' defence and slid the ball past the exposed keeper, to secure the fourth win in the last five matches.

PLYMSTOCK UTD 3-3 MOUSEHOLE, SWPD1W, SATURDAY 28TH OCTOBER, AT DEAN CROSS Mousehole came away with only a single point after conceding three goals from a winning position with less than half an hour to go. And in similar circumstances to the opening-day 4-4 draw at St Dennis, The Green and Whites had mixed feelings after seemingly securing all three points at one stage, while also being relieved to hear the final whistle as they clung on in the face of the hosts' bombardment. The Seagulls, with four wins in the last five matches, were without Tyler Tonkin, Bradley Wills, Jordan Adlard, Yeshe Briar and Josh Otto, but included young Byron Wood at right back and former Scottish Premier League forward Calum Elliot in midfield. Plymstock had won their last three games. Both sides created half-chances in an evenly-contested first half-hour, but Mousehole went ahead in the 37th minute when a fast break down the right hand side led to Luke Johnson firing over after being partially tripped in the area. Referee Andrew Glanville then sparked a major talking point by awarding a penalty which Matt McIlroy hammered in, and three minutes later he doubled the score by converting from close range after a short-corner routine involving Kevin Lawrence and Luke Johnson. The Seagulls continued on top in the early stages of the second half, with Luke Johnson driving a superb 20-yard volley against the bar, and it was 3-0 on 52 minutes when Kevin Lawrence's flighted free kick from just outside the left-hand corner of the box slipped in at the far post. But just after the hour, Plymstock's substitutions and changed tactics had instant impact with two goals in three minutes, and shortly afterwards only Steve Parker-Billinge's close-range save kept Mousehole ahead. But the lead looked fragile as the buoyant hosts put The Seagulls' defence under constant pressure. The comeback was completed with an 85th minute penalty when Kevin Lawrence was adjudged to have committed a

foul on the edge of the area. Plymstock continued to power forward and came very close to a winner in the 4th minute of added time when a goalbound drive was diverted to safety via Liam Andrew's knee.
